What's New: This month, we are talking about treatment planning and highlighting trainings in Relias to help providers further their knowledge when collaborating with members in the development and implementation of treatment and recovery plans.

Goals! Objectives! Interventions! Oh My! Instead of looking at treatment plans as just another document that needs to be completed, look at it from a different lens. Treatment plans are like road maps in that they help guide a member's treatment while they are on their road to recovery. The members goals are like the destination the member wants to be or achieve at the end of treatment. The objectives are like the directions along the route that help members achieve their goals and reach their destination.

Objectives are what the member is going to do to achieve their goal. They are broken into smaller steps that can be achieved along the journey and serve as milestones or checkpoints to their destination. Interventions are like the vehicles or resources that are used by the providers to help the members achieve their goals, objectives and reach their destination. Relias spotlight will explore how goals, objectives and interventions are used in various levels of care when creating treatment and/or recovery plans.

Why It Matters: The treatment plan for a member is not a one size fits all. The information and results from the members comprehensive diagnostic assessment including the functional assessment or CANS, help guide the development of the treatment plan.

In collaboration with the member, the provider helps the member set individualized goal(s) and measurable objectives that can be achieved within treatment as they work towards their goal(s). Throughout the course of treatment, members may experience changes and the treatment plan should be used as a working document. Changes can be due to a goal achievement and/or a new behavior or barrier, and the treatment plan is reviewed and updated to reflect the members current needs. Treatment plan review provides an opportunity for the provider and member to reflect on progress and celebrate successes. All services should have a service specific treatment plan and progress notes on the services provided must be tied back to the treatment plan. Listed below is a helpful guide on the timeline requirements of initial and treatment plan reviews within the Optum Idaho Behavioral Health Plan.

*Indicates that plans should be reviewed and updated as frequently as clinically necessary to meet the member's needs, however the minimum time before each review cannot exceed the timelines listed above.
