Hello Providers,

Kinship caregiving is a term we're hearing more often. However, kinship caregiving is not anything new. In fact, families have been helping raise relative children for decades but kinship caregiving or kin care, for short, has been receiving more attention in recent years. Kinship care includes relationships developed through informal arrangements, legal custody, guardianship order, a relative foster care placement or kinship adoption.

It's estimated that two million children (about the population of Nebraska) are in some sort of kin care relationship and that one in 11 children live in kinship care at some point before turning 18. The organization, Grandfamilies, reports over 10,500 grandparents in Idaho are responsible for their grandchildren and for every one child in Foster Care, there are 13 children being raised by family outside of the foster care system. Many of these families are doing this informally and without additional support.

According to the Annie E. Casey Foundation, research shows that placement of a child with a known family member has many benefits:

o Less difficulty adjusting

- Less likely to experience school and social disruptions
- Less likely to experience new or worsening mental health problems
- Are more likely to stay with siblings as well as maintain lifelong family connections
- o Improves overall stability with fewer moves and lower re-abuse rates
